Founded in 1978 as Chinese Community Social Service and Health Council (CCSSHC). CCSSHC addressed many health and social issues that Chinese community had faced, and became more influential force with over 40 agency members. In 2009, CCSSHC renamed as ***AHSSC*** and expanded memberships to other Asian communities.
